

In the name of God Amen I Elizabeth Camp of Great Parrinydon in the County of Essex widow being perfect and sound in mind and memory praise be given to Almighty God for the same to make and ordaine this my last will and testament in mannor and forme following that is to say first and principally I bequeath my soul into the hands of almighty God that gave it hoping through the meritorious death and passion of our blessed lord and Saviour Jesus Christ to redeem free pardon and remission of all my sins and to inherit everlasting life, and my body to the earth from wherto it was taken there to be buried at the discretion of my exutors hereafter named, and as touthing that small temporal estate whith all mighty God hath bene pleased to intrust me with I give and dispose thereof as followeth, First I will that all my debts and funeral charges shall be paid and discharged Item. I give and devise unto my Loving sonn Jonathan Camp the sum of five pounds Item. I give more unto my sonn Jonathan Camp all the smith working tools whatsoever whish were my husbands Item. I give to my Loving daughter Grace the now wife of John Dane one shilling Item. I give and devise the sum of thirty five pounds to be intrusted in the hands of my loving son Jonathan Camp ~ ~ ~ ~ for and towards the nessary reliefe of my said daughter Grace to be paid to her, twenty shillings at a time to support and assist her in her extreamity as often as he shall see greate _____ and in case it shall happen that my said daughter should depart this life before the said sum of thirty five pounds be all paid, then I do give and devise the said sum that shall at the time of her death be so remaineing to my said sonn Jonathan Camp immediatly after her decease. Item, I give to my loving sister the wife of Leonard Meayor the sum of five shillings. Item I give unto my daughter in law Elizabeth Seames the sum of five shillings and my mind will and meaning is that all my houshold goods shall be equally devided into three parts and one part thereof I give and bequeath to my above said sonn Jonathan Camp and another part I give and bequeth to my above named daughter Grace and the other part I do give to my loving friend Richard Hedgeidon, Item I give and bequeth all my wearing cloths both linning and wollen to my loving daughter Grace, Item I give and bequeath to my brother in law Leonard Meayer the sum of ten shillings, Item. I do give and bequeath to my above said friend Richard Hedgeidon the sum of ten shillings, and I do herby ordaine and make the above named Leonard Meager and Richard Hedgeidon joynt executors of this my last will and testament desiroing them faithfully to execute and fulfill the same and to see me ___ buried in the burying place at Roydon where my loving husband Edward

Camp was buridd, Dated this fourteenth day of December  1702
