In the name of God Amen. The sixth day of August in the 17<sup>th</sup> year of the Raigne of our Sovereigne Lord Charles the Second by the grace of God of England Scotland France & Ireland King defender of the Faith Anno Domini 1664 I John Campe of Snowes in the parish of Nazing in the County of Essex yeoman being sicke & weake & yet of perfect mind & memory. Prayed be Almighty God for the same considering the uncertainty of this mortall life which is best compared to the grasse & flowers of the field & things most fraile & uncertaine. And being desirous to leave the substance & estate which it hath pleased God to bestow upon me to my loving wife & children & friends to be enjoyed after in peace & quietness do make & ordaine this my last will & Testament in manner & forme following. First & principally I doe bequeath my soul into the hands of Almighty God my Creator trusting through the alone meritts & passion of Jesus Christ my Redeemer to have full & free pardon for all my Sinnes & to be made an Inheritor of his eternall Kingdome & Glory for my body that the earth of which it was made to be decently interred at the discretion of my Executor here after named. Item: I give & bequeath unto my loving wife Mary Campe 20 pounds of lawfull money of England to be paid to her within one yeare after my decease by my Executor. Item: I give & bequeath unto my eldeste sonne John Campe my house which I now dwell in Comonly called or known by the name of Snowes with all the houses & landes to the same belongyng to him & heires for ever. Item: I give & bequeath unto my sonne Thomas Campe my house at Long Greene the which John Halles now liveth in Comon called or known by the name of Lawrants with all the houses & lands to the same belonging to him & his heires for ever. Item: I give & bequeath unto my sonne James Campe 50 pounds of lawfull money of England to be paid to him within one year after mydecease by my Executor. Item: I give & bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Campe my house which is now in the occupation of Jonas Gardiner being in the Parish of Amwell in the County of Hertford with all belonging to the same. And also I give untomy aforesaid daughter Elizabeth Campe one hundred pounds of lawfull money of England to be paid unto my wife Mary Campe within one Moneth of my decease by my Executor for the use of my saide daughter. And further my will & mind is that if my foresaid daughter shall depart her naturall life before she shall attaine to the years of Eighteen That then the said hundred pounds to be equally divided between my two sonnes John Campe & JamesCampe.

Item: I give & bequeath unto my brother William Campe 10 pounds of lawfull money of England to be paid to him within one yeare after my decease by my Executor. Item: I give & bequeathe unto my loveing wife Mary Campe & my brotherinlaw Henry Marson 10 pounds of lawfull money of England to be paid to them within moneth after my decease by my Executor. Item: I give unto my beloved wife one Silver Tankard & one Trunke of Lynnen standing in the chamber over the Hall. Andalso half the household goods in the house. And the other half I give to be divided equally amongst my four children. Item: All the rest of my goods chattells Creditts & debts whatsoever before herein not disposed of my Debts being paid & my funerall expenses being satisfied I give & bequeath unto John Campe myeldest sonne who I doe make & ordaine my Executor of this my last will & Tetament revoaking all other wills & Testaments whatsoever. And Lastly I request & appoint George Campe of the parish of Epping yeoman & William Campe of the parish of Chesthunts Tanner my brothers And my two brothers in law Henry Marson of the parish of Hertfoord Tanner & Thomas Rayment of Waterfoord in the parish of Dengie to be overseers of this my last will & Testament desiring they will see the same performed & I doe give them towards their paines 20s apeece.
