

In the name of God amen the XXvii day of July In the year of our Lord God 1585 I Richard Camp of Nasing in the county of Essix syck Of body but whole mynd & perfect memory God have the praise do make & ordain this My last will & testament in mannor & Form following First I remend my soule into the hands of Allmighte God beliving to be saved by the grace of Jesus Chryste & my body I yeald to the earth in hope of the resurrection with the rest in the Last day concerning my worldly goods I give & despose them as followeth I give and bequeth to my sonnes Robert William Frances & Richard to every one of them ten pounds of lawfull mony of England with sum of forte pounds shalbe payed oute of my lande to my sayd sonnes their severall portions within two years next after my wyves deceasse also I give & bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Camp five pounds of lawfull English money to be paid to her in like mannor as her brothers portions afore sayd < if any of my children die before the payment of their legals then my will & mind is the dead be equally among the remaining alive > Item my will & mind is that if my wife die before my youngest son com to his age of 21 yeares or if my said son being of age at his mothers deceasse refuse to pawe the legasres in maner as is before expressed then by vertue of this my will I give full power and autorythe to Mr Thomas Hall of Nazeing my Wyfes uncle & Mr Robert Hall of Claveringhambury my Wyfes brother and to either of Them to sell my house & land to the uttermost value & with yet of the name anything therso to pay my children their severall legas_es as is before expressed & the residue to remain to my said youngest son all the rest of my goods I wholly give & bequeath to Magdalen my wife whome I make my sole executixe and concerning my debts I apoynt Mr Thomas Hall my wyfes uncle aforesaid to pay the same so far as fourteen pounds & a noble being yte of the price of a crofte called Prake Field lately sould unto him will extend
